Professional Education Resources for Thyroid Disease

Thyroid disease is more common than diabetes and heart disease.¹ According to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, 27 million people suffer from a thyroid disorder and about half of these people have yet to receive a diagnosis.² Women are at substantially greater risk for developing thyroid disorders than men. According to the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality, 12.6 million adult women in the U.S. reported receiving treatment for thyroid disease in 2008.³

In 2000, the American Association of Clinical Endocrinologists designated January as Thyroid Awareness Month to increase knowledge and raise public awareness of thyroid disease. In recognition of this designation, AmeriCares has compiled patient and professional education resources related to thyroid diagnosis and management to help safety net organizations continue to provide high quality care to their patients.
